Linville Dunaway, Corinth Christian Church 1 Kings 13:1-32 tells the story of a prophet who was commanded of God to deliver a message and to return without eating, or drinking, and to return by another way. He told this to both the king and to another prophet, showing that he knew and understood what God had ordered him to do. Still, he must have wanted to eat and drink, for when he was told that it would be alright for him to do it, he gave in and disobeyed the commandment.
