Just recently a man said unto me: "I read your article yesterday and it sure put me to thinking." My reply was this is why I am writing them. This is an my attempt to promote one's thinking."

All of the New Testament was and is our Lord's way to get mankind to open their ears to the truth. Just a short reading of <u>II Timothy 3:15-17</u> will tell us these things.

I have been writing this article along with weekly and monthly bulletins for over forty years now. Even at this time I will never fully know if my meager efforts have had much effect upon the readers. Only when we stand before the Lord will we know. In **Mark 4** our Lord gives us the story of the sower. In verse 14 He says: "The sower soweth the word." And in Matthew 13:37 He calls Himself the Sower of Good Seed, with the world being the field. This is what I have always felt myself to be, a sower of God's seed.

Secondly, as our Lord reveals this parable, He also tells us of the results of the seed sown. There is the wayside sowing, and there is stony ground sowing. And there is also the thorny ground. All of these heard the word but did not have the hearts to receive it, nor believe it.

And last of all, the seed also fell upon good ground. These not only heard, but they fully received it, and went to work in the field of the Lord, becoming productive in His kingdom.

When I just began my attempt to preach the gospel I was young, full of excitement and energy so much so that I thought I could convert the world, and for a while many people responded to the messages, but as time went forward I noticed that not everyone that I tried personally to convert would just not respond to the invitation to obey the gospel. I have presided at many funeral services where this has been the case. How sad it was and still is to stand over a dead body and to know that this person heard the demands of Christ, maybe even to some day obey them, but something took them away before they did. So in our story text every one of these heard the message but only one out of four took advantage of their opportunity to take hold of it. Sadly, today there are most likely some of you that are reading this that have never obeyed the invitation of our Lord Jesus.

So today, I want to encourage you at this time to hear Him, obey Him by repenting of all your past sins, believe Him to the confession with your mouth that He is the Christ, and to complete your act of salvation, be baptized in enough water to bury you. This symbolizes the death, burial, and resurrection of our Lord. Romans <u>6:3-5</u> tells us this. So today, don't be a forgetful hearer. Become an obedient one instead.


