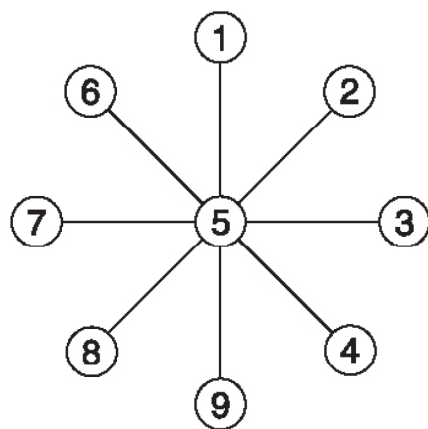

Family, one of 5, to get new home in Ravenna

A sign doesn't have to be posted saying, "Home, Sweet Home." All one has to do is look at the smiling faces to see the love in a new home at 302 Holly Street in Ravenna.

Debbie Fields was given the go-ahead to move in her new house, late one night a couple of weeks ago, too late to move furniture in. She was so anxious to live in the new house, she slept on the floor that night.

"I didn't care. I was coming home," she stated. "I've lived up here on this street about 50 years."

She lived in a trailer at the location of her new home. She applied for a new home with the Phase I renovation in Ravenna but was not accepted. Her new home is one of five in the Phase II renovation in Ravenna with at least two more homes being remodeled.

Fields said the contractors included her in the construction of her home. She chose a floor plan which did not have a hallway.

"This plan eliminates the hallway which gives a bigger living area," said her sister, Donna Alcorn.

"I love the kitchen space," Fields said.

Fields chose the flooring and paint color for the walls. Everyone but Fields was concerned about her choosing Papaya. Once it went on the walls, they all loved it.

Because Fields is handicapped, her daughter Crystal, son-in-law, Alek Sieger, and granddaughters, Kristin and Katelynn, live with her.

The house has three bed-

rooms to accommodate the extended family of five. The two bedrooms for adults are the same size, and the girls' bedroom is smaller. They all share one handicapped bathroom.

Alek took discarded pallets and built bunk beds and book shelves to get the most out of the small space. He has used the pallet wood to make other items for the new house.

Fields' father got a new house five years ago during Phase I, and it's right across the street. The family came to check on him at least once a day while their new home was under construction.

They also brought him meals. Now they can cook and carry the meals across the street to him.

When Fields' father's house was built, it was built up high enough to accommodate possible flooding. She said with a new dam, that she believes flooding is no longer an issue.

She added with the bad winter, she expected the flooding to go way up, but it didn't.

Crystal has plans for a garden next year. She has planted flower beds this year.

The family held an open house last Thursday. They attend church with most of the ones who stop by at New Beginning Fellowship.

Ravenna Mayor Estine Tipton stopped by the open house at Fields' home. She said this home is one of three completed in Phase II. Two more new homes will be completed.
