The annual Living Ar- school groups only, primarchaeology Weekend will once again celebrate Kentucky's historic and prehistoric heritage.


Artisans and craftspeople from across the country will gather at the Gladie Visitor Center in the Red River Gorge to demonstrate specialized skills from past cultures.

Some of the featured activities will include the making of stone tools, hide tanning, spear throwing, pottery and basketry. The Gladie Cabin will also be open for self-guided tours.

"This two-day event attracts people of all ages. It is Kentucky's longest-running archaeology event conducted for the public," said Wayna Adams, Forest Archaeologist with the Daniel Boone National Forest.

"The demonstrations are staged to provide students and visitors with a glimpse into our cultural past."
