

# Engineers Looking to Remain Atop District

The Estill County Engineers will take their unblemished district record to West Liberty this Friday where they will take on the Morgan County Cougars.

Estill continues to battle for the district title and at least a home game in the opening round.

The Engineers will take on a Cougar team that comes off six consecutive losses and a defense that is allowing 42 points per game.

Estill should not take this game lightly and take care of business before heading into the following week in a much anticipated matchup with Knott County Central.

KCC still remains alive in the district race with only a single loss to Breathitt County in a 56-47 shootout.

Central's QB has lit up the sky with his spirals to the tune of 247 yards per game with 20 TDs and only 1 INT.

Estill's secondary has been prone to the passing game, but just recently they shut down a good QB for Breathitt County with 3 interceptions.

Estill's ground game and control of time of possession will be a major weapon in this Senior Night Send-off.

Through seven games, the "Killer B's" (Bingham, Beckler, Blake Francisco) have shouldered the ground

game. Dawson Bingham is on his way to "back to back" 1,000 yard seasons with 975 yards (139 ypg) and 14 TDs, and Logan Beckler has enjoyed his move from QB to RB with 791 yards (113 ypg) and 7 TDs.

Even though he has been slowed with a knee injury, Blake Francisco has added 241 yards (40 ypg) and 4 TDs along with being the emotional leader for the Engineers.

A. Salyer has chipped in with 4 rushing TDs and senior K. Vaughn has made the most of his six carries with 2 runs to pay dirt.

On the other side of the ball, Bingham also leads in tackles with 74 and Int

with 3. A. Salyer has had his name called 53 times and Francisco is not far behind with 46 tackles.

Dylan Evans has scored twice from the defensive side with a "pick six" and a "scoop and score."

C. Harrison, T. O'Hair, J. Watkins, and T. Donahue have pressured QBs all year long with their 6 sacks and 12 TFL combined.

Hunter Osborne has anchored the secondary with his play usually against the #1 receiver.

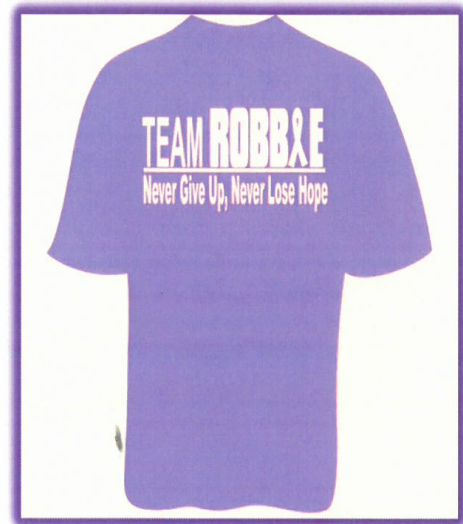
