

# Veteran goes on honor flight to Washington, D.C.

"It just started to rain, just a little bit," Snowden said. He described the day as cool and overcast.

The group went to the Women's Memorial for a sack lunch at midday. They were fed meals on the plane as they returned to Lexington.

There was a crowd of about 500 who welcomed the veterans back to Bluegrass Airport.

Snowden said the president of Toyota shook hands

with each veteran. While shaking hands, he placed a medallion in each veteran's hand. Toyota also gave each veteran a cap and a T-shirt to wear on the trip.

Snowden also received a pictorial book of Washington D.C.

Snowden joined the Navy in 1955. He was stationed abroad a destroyer, USS Norfolk, at the Gitmo Naval Base in Guatanomo Bay, Cuba.

He married his wife, Mary, in 1957. Mary joined

Snowden in this beautiful place to live. She was later evacuated back to the states with their baby during the Cuban missile crisis.

When Snowden's enlistment was up in 1959, he returned to Powell County. He could not get a job so he re-enlisted in the Navy for another four years.

This time he was sent on the USS Boston to Cyprus. Both Turkey and Greece were claiming Cyprus.

The Vietnam War had started up, but Snowden was

not sent there. After this tour of duty, the Snowdens bought a grocery store. Then they ran a feed and hardware store in Powell County.

In 1970, Snowden headed up the Powell's Valley Water District.

"When I was growing up, you had to carry water in a bucket," he stated.

While he was head of Powell's Valley Water District, that water company extended city water throughout Powell County and to Fur-

nace in Estill County.

When he retired after 27 years, he stated there was a water line along every rural road in Powell County.

Snowden said his wife has a birthday a day after his. This year, the family celebrated on her birthday.

Their son, Shannon, is an engineer. Daughter Kim teaches at Eastern Kentucky University and their other daughter, Amy, works for social services.

The Snowdens live in the Spout Springs area.

## EMTs revive man with Narcan

Narcan was used on an Irvine man who was passed out due to a suspected heroin overdose.

Emergency personnel were called to Estill Avenue just before midnight. A woman reported that her son was sitting on the toilet and was unresponsive, according to Irvine Officer John Sturniolo.

The officer added the male had a stainless steel spoon and a syringe which was half loaded with a clear liquid that field tested positive for heroin.

Sturniolo said the man was given Narcan by EMS.

He told the officer that he had bought and injected the heroin that day.

IPD took the spoon and syringe into evidence.

Sturniolo charged Tommy Lynn Farthing, 33, of Estill Ave., Irvine with possession of heroin and drug paraphernalia.

Farthing was arraigned in Estill District Court on October 10. He pleaded not guilty to both charges. District Judge William Leach scheduled a preliminary hearing for October 19.

Bail for Farthing was set at \$1,000 cash.

The term imagination is a fairly new usage of this word. In Webster's New World Dictionary, he has given us this idea, saying, "That this is an act of power of making up pictures or ideas in the mind of what is not present or of how things might not actually be."
