

> Remove all dried dirt with a wire brush, rinse and dry thoroughly. Sharpen dull tools using a whetstone or file. Sand off any rust spots **(interizing** with fine sandpaper and coat the metal with vegetable oil. Wipe tools a thin coat of linseed oil on wooden handles to prevent cracks. Store hand tools in a bucket of sand soaked in oil to further deter rust, and hang large tools after prepping for storage. Fully drain your garden hoses, repair any leaks or damaged sections, and coil and tie them for storage. - Brenda Weaver


