Staying comfortable, safe and alive in these conditions created the need for a new type of boot, known today as the cowboy boot.

The earliest designs were derived from the cavalry boot worn by soldiers during the Civil War. They needed boots that could easily slip into horse stirrups. The leather on the boots helped protect against bushes, rattlesnakes and other hazards many people are wearing they encountered in these dangerous conditions.
