

IPD, Sheriff's Activity Reports

Derek A. Bishop, 26, of Lebanon, In. was arrested Sunday, March 20 at 154 S. Madison in Irvine by Officer John Sturniolo.

Bishop was charged with disorderly conduct, menacing, public intoxication, and resisting arrest.

- Hope Renee Johnson, 37, of Sunrise Valley Road, Irvine was arrested by Officer Sam Hensley on Saturday, March 14 for operating a motor vehicle under the influence.

- Tyrone Stamper, 45, of Main Street, Irvine was charged Thursday, March 17 with alcohol intoxication and menacing by Officer John Sturniolo.

- A bench warrant from Estill District Court was served on Preston Hardy, 27, of Mt. Crest, Irvine by Officer Sturniolo on March 5. Hardy was found guilty in 2015 of failure to maintain insurance. The bench warrant states that he has failed to pay his fine. Bail of \$138 cash was set by District Judge Bo Leach.

- Two bench warrants were served by Sgt. Michael Gross, March 15 on Timera A. Neal, 22, of Flinchum Ridge, Ravenna.

One warrant says that Neal was found guilty in 2014 in Estill District Court

of public intoxication, possession of marijuana and drug paraphernalia. Judge Bo Leach said she had failed to pay a \$238 fine and a \$30 service fee. Judge Leach set Neal's bond at \$238 cash.

She was found guilty in 2015 of license to be in possession. This warrant states she also failed to pay fines/costs. Judge Leach said she could pay \$193 in fines/costs or spend four days in jail.

- Two people were transported by ambulance to Marcum & Wallace Hospital on Thursday after a two vehicle wreck on the Richmond Road Thursday. Deputy James Smith investigated the wreck which occurred around 8:21 p.m.

The report states that Carey Hunter of Corinth, Ky. was in the turning lane to turn left on the Bypass while Jordan Dixon of Irvine was in the lane headed toward Richmond.

The light turned green, and Deputy Smith said the two vehicles collided in the intersection. Dixon said he slammed on his brakes when he saw Hunter's vehicle but was unable to avoid the collision.

Hunter and her passenger, Chris Walters, were transported to the hospital

for treatment of their injuries. Smith charged Hunter with driving under the influence, failing to give right of way to vehicle passing in opposite direction, and possession of drug paraphernalia.

- A driver reportedly was racing when he wrecked on the Winchester Road on Friday night.

Deputy Randy Farthing said that Canyon Kelley, of SandHill Church Road, Irvine, apparently lost control of his vehicle and went over an earth embankment on the Winchester Road, about two miles from Irvine.

Farthing said the Volkswagen Passat overturned and came to rest on its top. Kelley was trapped inside and had to be extricated by the Estill County Rescue Squad.

Neighbors near the scene of the wreck said they had watched the car racing several times, but they did not see the wreck.

Kelley was transported to Marcum & Wallace Hospital for treatment of his injuries.

- Rodney Cates, 47, of Paint Lick was arrested by Deputy Farthing on Sunday, March 20. He was charged with public intoxication on Raintree Ct., Irvine.

And if you would, please bow with me for the closing prayer". Upstairs in church we always sang, "He Arose" and "Were You There When They Crucified My Lord". The sanctuary smelled heavenly because of the lilies that were placed there in memory of loved ones gone on to their reward. The choir would enter the choir loft and present the most beautiful Cantata, songs about sacrifice and love for one another. Communion was passed and so was the offering plates and then, Brother Jim Killian would end the Easter service with a prayer that, as a child, seemed to drag on forever. Now that I'm older, I appreciate his prayers. He taught me the correct way to pray, even though I didn't realize it at the time!

Easter lunch was at Granny Hicks' house but NO ONE was allowed to change out of their Sunday clothes until Daddy had taken pictures of us all. One picture after another, me with Beth, me alone, Beth alone, me and Beth with Mom, me

and Beth with Daddy, then Granny and Papaw. You know what I mean, don't you? Your family did the same thing! Finally, we could change clothes and help put lunch on the table. Ham; home canned, green beans from Granny's garden; mashed potatoes; potato salad; deviled eggs with greens and last but not least, Granny's homemade yeast rolls. Boston Crème Pie was always our dessert. Makes me hungry just thinking about it!

Granny had chickens at her house, and saved the whitest eggs for us to color. Daddy helped us color them the day before Easter and to end the celebration, we hid the eggs. Underneath our gloves, our fingernails were the same color as the eggs! That silly little wire holder with the PAAS coloring kits never worked to dip the eggs! Sound familiar?!

Finally home for the night, we'd hang our Easter outfits carefully in the closet. Our corsages went back in their tissue paper and the fridge so we could wear them again the next Sunday. And the eggs? Well...Daddy would let me and Beth throw them across the road at our great, big, mailbox!

Shhhh, don't tell Momma okay?
