Spiritual Motivation

As a proclaimed Christian, what motivates me to chose to live and do the things I do. The answer for me is: "Because I have a deep abiding respect for the Bible, and a strong belief in its content. Whatever it clearly states, this we ought to do. Anything else is frivolous or vain. Jesus clearly has said in **Luke 6:46**: "And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say." Then to demonstrate His point, He tells of a wise master builder who dug deep into the earth and laid a good foundation, and when the storms beat upon the finished building, it stood unscathed. This was a wise man, but on the other hand, another built his house without a solid foundation and so, when the storms came, it was destroyed because it had no firm foundation.

Of course our Lord is connecting this earthly story to a spiritual condition that exists among many men today. Just how many do we suppose that are being wise men who will read the Bible (the blue print) of life and fill in its precepts? Sadly, not many are really doing it. Failing to follow God's blue print will bring only a failure when in judgment we will stand!

I think that most would like to go to God's eternal heaven after we are judged, but what will be the determining factor regarding if we go there? **Hebrews 4:1-3** says: "Let us therefore fear, lest, a promise being left us of entering into his rest, any of you should seem to come short of it. For unto us was the gospel preached, as well as unto them: but the word preached did not profit them, not being mixed with faith in them that heard it. For we which have believed do enter into rest, as he said, As I have sworn in my wrath, if they shall enter into my rest: although the works were finished from the foundation of the world."

Now to make some strong remarks toward anyone who claims to be a believer in Jesus, let me ask, did you attend worship last Sunday? If you failed to do this, then you are an unbeliever. **Hebrews 10:25** says: "Not to forsake the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is." What type of living manner are you?

Again, did you eat the Lord's Supper with the church last Sunday? Well, if you did not, you do not believe the Bible because it says in **Luke 22:14-20**: "To do this in memory of me." Where was your mind last Lord's day? Paul said in **I Corinthians 11:26** "for as often." How often is that? **Acts 20:7** says the apostles came together to break bread upon the first day of the week. Did you do this? If not, you are not a faithful Christian.

Then did you appear with the church to make a financial gift of your prosperity? **I Corinthians 16:1-2**, "Did you contribute to the needs of the church." If not, you are not an obedient member.

In closing, the most important question I have saved for our conclusion. Have you as a claimant of religion, do you have the promise of salvation given dearly by the Bible in **Matthew 28:18-20**; **Acts 2:38**; and **Ephesians 1:13-14**. If you are really a faithful believer in the Bible, then you have done the things required of you in order to become a Christian indeed.

But to be as gentle and concerned as I can be, this I say to warn you. You are most likely dead in your trespasses and sins, because you have not obeyed the plan given to make you free. Please read carefully **Romans 6:16-18**. See for yourselves just what the Bible teaches.

starting at 4:00 p.m. Join us as we hunt for over 1,000 eggs that are filled with all sorts of goodies!

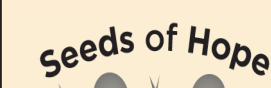
