Estill Community Chorus

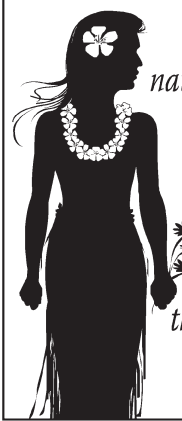

How Quickly Is The Blinking of an Eye?

I don't recall but one man in my life who said that he did not believe in Heaven or Hell. neither the resurrection of all the dead someday. This is an evidence that he could be considered as an unbeliever. But sadly there are many people that will confess that they believe the Bible, but are not as yet obeying its precepts. So each unbeliever could all be classified as being unified as unsaved, unprepared when our Lord's return to judge us all.

Several times in **the Revelation letters** chapter **2:5-17**, **chapter 3:3**, **chapters 22:7** and **verses 12 and 20**, the Lord says: "Surely I come quickly." Also in **I Corinthians 15:50-51**, it is written, "Now this I say brethren that flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God. Neither does corruption inherit incorruption. Behold, I show you a mystery. We shall not all sleep (or die), but we shall all be changed."
