Fire Chief Tony Murphy said that the fire station was in need of a new copier. He said the current copier is one that is intended for personal use and the fire department is going through a lot of ink cartridges. City clerk Robin Powell said that if they added another copier to their current agreement for five years, it would cost the city approximately \$164 per month.

Mayor Noland said that the Mushroom Festival went great. He commended Francine Bonny and everyone else that was involved with the festival on their hard work. He said that there were two days of perfect weather for the festival and commended Tobo Bryant on the excellent turnout for the car show that was held on Saturday during the festival.

Police Chief Brad Smith said that a \$500 refund would be issued to Tonya Noll for her license to sell alcohol. He said that Noll had paid for the license in August but didn't open until November. Smith said that the business was only open for a couple of months before it closed.

Councilwoman Williams asked if someone else opened a business and only stayed open for two months if they would also be issued a refund and Smith replied that they would not get a refund.

Tony Murphy requested that new flags be purchased for the fire station and Mayor Noland said that he already had new flags for the station in his office.

The city council will meet again in two weeks on May 9th at 7 p.m.

The program will hire a coordinator and two prosecuting attorneys.

Other counties which have used the Rocket Docket program report savings in jail costs.

Magistrates were advised to look over the budget and bring back their recommendations to the May 23 court meeting at 4:30 p.m.

Following that meeting, the budget will be forwarded to Frankfort. The final budget will be returned to the fiscal court in June after the state makes any changes to it.
