## Great Plainness of Speech

If there was a time for great plainness of speech, surely these are the days. I never thought that I would ever live to see the religious spirit of unconcern that is presently prevalent in most places. Paul says plainly in **II Timothy 3:4**, "That in the closing of time that men would be lovers of pleasure more than lovers of God."

In **II Corinthians 3:11-16** Paul is telling the Jews and all the world today that the Old Testament letter of Moses is done away when Jesus shed His blood upon the cross (**verse 14**), but even unto this day we have many people among the Jews who do not believe that the old law was done away in Christ Jesus. He says in this very passage that a veil of unbelief remains upon their hearts. Then he warns them if they will return unto the Lord, this veil shall be taken away. This can only be accomplished when men obey the Gospel of Christ, and worship according to the principals of the new will and testament of Jesus Christ. This is the true blessings of the New Testament letter, which could not be done thru or by the old law of Moses.

In **Habakkuk 2:1-2**, when standing his watch for the Lord said, what shall the Lord say to me? Then God answered him and said, "Write the vision and make plain upon tables, and that he may run that readeth it." So today this is what I have tried to do since I began to try to preach, and still trying to do the same thing today.

Perhaps I could change my tactics and lure a great crowd of people by giving them a feeding frenzie, or promise great evenings of Nashville type of musical entertainment, or even give all the senior citizens free trips to Gatlinburg, etc. etc. **This will bring them in but it won't bring them to Christ!** So then is it to bring them to attendances or to preach the gospel with the motivation to save their souls? Those who are guilty of these tactics will just sweep this admonition under the rug perhaps saying: "He is just jealous of our great attendance." **Yes indeed!** I am jealous of these just as Paul was when he said in II Corinthians 11:1-3 that he was jealous over them with a godly jealousy, he thru preaching the plain truth had them married or promised to Christ, but thru subtlety of Satan working through man had beguiled them from the simple teachings of Jesus. Yes, I am jealous, **but not envious!** When I preach the gospel my only desire is that it is all truth, the truth that will save and keep saved, when men believe and obey it.

Now briefly a reminder of our term, great plainness of speech. I want to warn all brethren who may be attending a place where the Bible truth is preaching concerning the plan of salvation, and the observance of eating the Lord's supper each Lord's Day, but have retained in your worship the wrong name of the church, the playing of things without life giving sounds instead of singing only. **Hebrews 2:12** is very plain on this, just as **Romans 16:16** is on the name of Christ's church. This is not all that men have done in polluting the simple gospel. Just one warning in closing. God did not let Moses enter into the promised land, because of this one infraction. He smote the rock instead of doing what God said: "Speak to the rock!" Read **Numbers 20:7-12**. See if I tell the truth! So if people think for one minute that they can dilly dally around with the word of God and still be blessed, they may be fooling themselves. No apologies.
