The award will be used to educate patients about the importance of colon cancer screenings. The American Cancer Society recommends colon cancer screenings should begin at age 50 said Candie McMaine and appropriate referral, specific for both males and females with average risk for developing the disease.

If you have a family history or other risk factors for colon cancer it may be necessary to begin screening at an earlier age. Speak with your primary care provider about when you should get your first colon cancer screening. Screening tests can find colon cancer early, when it is most treatable.
