KY 89 (North Main Street/Winchester Road) at the north city limits of Irvine in Estill County will be closed overnight on Thursday, June 16. The road will be closed at milepoint 12.1, between Estill Springs Elementary School and Geneva Avenue. The closure will begin at 7 p.m. on Thursday, and the road should be open to traffic by 7 a.m. on Friday, June 17.

No detour will be posted, but drivers can use KY 499 (the Irvine bypass) and KY 52 (Richmond Road) as an alternate route. Motorists should plan their trips accordingly

The closure is necessary for utility work related to the ongoing project to widen KY 89 on the north side of Irvine.
