Free disposal of household hazardous waste of materials accepted including oil based paints, paint thinners, herbicides, insecticides, pesticides, old gasoline, pool chemicals, cleaning products, mercury, double bagged & wetted asbestos, household batteries, used motor oil, drain cleaners, lawn chemicals, bleach, solvents, anti-freeze, hobby chemicals, aerosols, fluorescent lamp bulbs, acids, household fire extinguishers,

propane tanks (BBQ grill type and smaller), and household items that display the warnings: flammable, combustible, poison or toxic, harmful when swallowed, corrosive, caustic, acidic or causes severe burns, irritant, oxidizer, inhalation hazard, volatile, reactive, danger or caution. Materials not accepted include electronic waste, explosives and ammunition, radioactive materials (smoke detectors), unidentified materials, medical waste, sharps & needles, and non-household business waste.

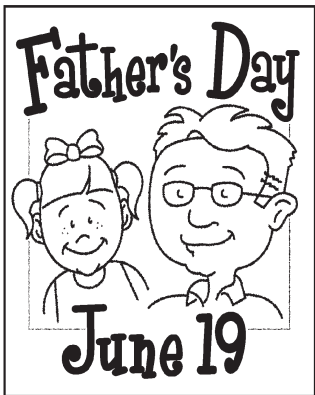

How many times have you heard someone comment: "O, how sacred that child is," or saying it in reference to some saying or even a deed performed. It may be of interest to Bible readers that this word is not found as it is many times misused, not even in the entire Bible. This according to the Bible translators is used as a comparative to describe a most holy thing or things. So not willing to be a confuser of others, or myself, I will mention a few things that are holy, and to use the comparative term sacred.

First, God's word is holy (sacred). In **II Timothy 3:14-15** "and from a child thou hast known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus."

Secondly, our very body is a Holy thing (sacred). **Genesis 1:26-27**, here is told that man was created in the image and likeness of God. "Thereby being holy because it had known no sin." So our bodies are a sacred thing to almighty God.

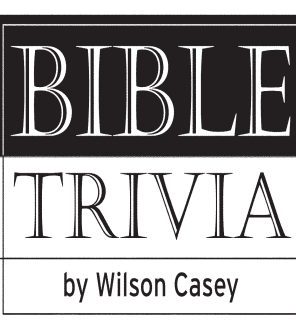

And the apostles added (**Acts 4:12**), "Neither is there salvation in any other; for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved."

So in conclusion, just these few things are holy and sacred, simply because they are ordained by the master's hand.

Living your life as a Christian is a holy act and sacred thing. Are you doing it?
