Have you ever noticed that when someone yells FIRE, it will get the attention of everyone in ear shot. So men are afraid of fire, but when we mention the word fire from God, many act as though there is no vengeance of fire coming upon the unrepentant of this earth.

In <u>II Thessalonians 1:6-9</u>, "Seeing it is a righteous thing with God to recompense tribulation to them that trouble you. And to you who are troubled rest with us, when the Lord Jesus shall be revealed from Heaven with his mighty angels in a flaming fire taking vengeance on them that know not God and obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, who will be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of his power."


