Kentucky Baptists respond to call for help in West Virginia

Kentucky Baptist volunteers assembled quickly to meet needs in West Virginia where floodwaters have killed at least 23 people in the past week.

"Our neighbors are desperate and hurting, and need us to respond," said Kentucky Baptist Disaster Relief Director Coy Webb.

President Barack Obama signed a federal disaster declaration this weekend after flash flooding in West Virginia destroyed more than 3,500 homes, 180 businesses, 43 bridges statewide and toppled powerlines, leaving residents without electricity.

Authorities fear the number of fatalities could rise because some people remain unaccounted for in Greenbrier County.

Good news came Monday afternoon when two

men presumed dead after a camper was swept away by rushing water were found alive.

Volunteers from Kentucky Baptist Disaster Relief, an arm of the Kentucky Baptist Convention, are working to clear mud from homes and preparing meals for survivors and relief workers. They have also set up mobile shower and laundry facilities.

Additional Kentucky Baptists are expected to be deployed in coming days as West Virginia residents brace for another potential round of flood.
