Replacement Bred Heifer Sale

The East Kentucky Heifer Development Committee will be sponsoring its' eighteenth Replacement Bred Heifer Sale on Saturday, September 17, 2016 at the Lee City Stockyard. The sale will begin at 1:00pm. Inspection will begin at 12:00 noon. The Lee City Stockyard is located approx. 2 miles off the Mountain Parkway on Route 205 about 10 miles east of Campton in Wolfe County. There will be free delivery for purchases of 10 or more up to a 200 mile radius of Lee City.

There will be 85 bred heifers offered for sale and all qualify for CAIP funding. These heifers have been professionally developed in cooperation of local County Agents and UK Beef Specialist. Each heifer has been vaccinated against the respiratory disease complex, clostridial diseases, and reproductive diseases. Each heifer has been treated for internal and external parasites. Each heifer had to meet or exceed a pelvic area of 160 square centimeters. Pelvic Area was age adjusted to one year of age for all heifers. All heifers were tested and confirmed BVD persistent infection (PI) negative.

Most of the heifers will calve between early February and mid-March and all heifers are guaranteed bred for 60days following the sale.
