My Fellow Estill Countians,

I would like to take this opportunity to announce to all of you that I, Christopher Shawn Flynn, have officially filed as a Democratic candidate for the office of Estill County Sheriff in the May 22, 2018 election. I have thought long and hard about this decision over the last several years.

I honorably served my country for 8 years as a United States Marine and now want to serve YOU, the citizens of Estill County as your sheriff. I am the son of Glendle and Brenda Flynn, I am married to Ashley (Watson) Flynn, and we are blessed with two children. I was born in February 1986, just a month after my father took office as sheriff of this county. Many of my early childhood memories are from this period. I remember having to stay late at the courthouse for them to finish mailing out tax bills. I remember him having to leave the dinner table unexpectedly in response to a call from dispatch and hoping he would be back home safe. Thankfully he did most of the time, except for an occasional broken rib or two. I remember walking through the courthouse thinking that maybe one day I could hold one of these offices. These first years of my life formed my dream of one day serving the citizens of this county.

In November 2004 I signed up with the United States Marine Corps. While on active duty I served as Recon Marine with 2nd and 3rd Reconnaissance Battalions. I deployed once to Operation Iraqi Freedom and twice with the 26th Marine Expeditionary Unit. In 2011 I was promoted to the rank of Staff Sergeant. Shortly after that it was time for me to make my decision to re-enlist or not. I decided against it and moved back home in 2012. For the last five years I have lived here with my wife and children. I have owned and operated Flynn's Auto Service, Inc. since 2013. I have enjoyed talking and getting to know many of you through this business.

Now that you know a little more about me, I may be the youngest candidate on the ballot so far, but I do have a background that shows who and what I am about. I learned firsthand at an early age that the duties and responsibilities of a sheriff are quite extensive and the hours are long. The Marines taught me leadership by example. Being a business owner has taught me that I don't get paid unless I work hard. I have always put 100% into everything that I have done and plan on doing the same in this campaign and as your sheriff.


In the upcoming weeks I will begin to travel throughout the county. I look forward to meeting as many of you as I can and earning your support. Please feel free to ask me questions and get to know me better. I want to learn what concerns you have and what your thoughts are on how to improve this fine county. With your support we can make it even better. Just remember "I" can't win, but together "WE" can!
