

I honorably served my country for 8 years as a United States Marine and now want to serve YOU, the citizens of Estill County as your sheriff. I am the son of Glendle and Brenda Flynn, I am married to Ashley (Watson) Flynn, and we are blessed with two children. I was born in February 1986, just a month after my father took office as sheriff of this county. Many of my early childhood memories are from this period. I remember having to stay late at the courthouse for them to finish mailing out tax bills. I remember him having to leave the dinner table unexpectedly in response to a call from dispatch and hoping he would be back home safe. Thankfully he did most of the time, except for an occasional broken rib or two. I remember walking through the courthouse thinking that maybe one day I could hold one of these offices. These first years of my life formed my dream of one day serving the citizens of this county.

In November 2004 I signed up with the United States Marine Corps. While on active duty I served as Recon Marine with 2nd and 3rd Reconnaissance Battalions. I deployed once to Operation Iragi Freedom and twice with the 26th Marine Expeditionary Unit. In 2011 I was promoted to the rank of Staff Sergeant. Shortly after that it was time for me to make my decision to re-enlist or not. I decided against it and moved back home in 2012. For the last five years I have lived here with my wife and children. I have owned and operated Flynn's Auto Service, Inc. since 2013. I have enjoyed talking and getting to know many of you through this business.

Now that you know a little more about me, I may be the youngest candidate on the ballot so far, but I do have a background that shows who and what I am about. I learned firsthand at an early age that the duties and responsibilities of a sheriff are quite extensive and the hours are long. The Marines taught me leadership by example. Being a business owner has taught me that I don't get paid unless I work hard. I have always put 100% into everything that I have done and plan on doing the same in this campaign and as your sheriff.
