# **Drop-Offs Began Monday for Operation Christmas Child**

This month, Salem Baptist Church, will again serve as the Estill County drop-off location for the Samaritan's Purse project Operation Christmas Child, joining nearly 5,000 U.S. locations collecting gift-filled shoeboxes for children in need around the world. These shoeboxes are transformed into gifts of hope filled with fun toys, school supplies and hygiene items. All local shoebox gifts will be collected during the project's National Collection Week, Nov. 13 - 20. After being dropped off, Operation Christmas Child will deliver these shoebox gifts to children living in poverty overseas. This year, local residents hope to reach an area goal of 10,670 shoebox gifts that will contribute toward the 2017 global goal of reaching 12 million children. "We have an opportunity in Estill County to give these simple shoebox gifts that will make a lasting impact on children across the world," says local year-round volunteer April Stone (april. stone33@yahoo.com). "For many of these children, this shoebox is the first gift they have ever received.. It sends a message that God loves them, and they are not forgotten."

Operation Christmas Child is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international Christian relief and evangelism organization headed by Franklin Graham. The mission of Operation Christmas Child is to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to children in need around the world and, together with the local church worldwide, to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. Since 1993, Operation Christmas Child has collected and delivered more than 146 million gift-filled shoeboxes to children in more than 160 countries and territories.
