# County votes to raise occupational tax to 2%

The Estill Fiscal Court announced Mon-million just to KACO and Hinkles. day their intentions to raise the occupational tax to two percent for persons employed in Estill County.

The payroll tax was first levied at one percent around the late 80's and was raised to 1.25 percent in 2007.

Magistrate Marty Snowden asked that the increase be for 18 months, with an expiration date of June 30, 2019. He estimated the tax increase will generate over a million dollars during that time.

Snowden stated the county owes \$1.4

"You can't borrow your way out of it," he

Snowden said the tax increase was necessary because of the flat-line economy.

The exact date the tax increase begins was uncertain at Monday's fiscal court meeting. First reading was given to the ordinance

on the payroll tax Monday night. A second reading is usually held 7-14 days after the first reading. A week from Monday's meeting will be Christmas.


