The lawsuit states that Mitchell's paychecks all reflected money being withheld to pay insurance premiums for Mitchell.

It adds that Mitchell was injured on December 19, 2016 and became unable to work. He applied for his insurance benefits which with medical bills and disability income.

The lawsuit says that Mitchell was informed by policies that they had been in court.
