> The famous Flexible Flyer came into being. For generations of children's sleds went in only one direction. Then on Valentine's Day in 1889, a Jersey farmer named Samuel L. Allen patented a sled with a steering mechanism. The prototype was built from spare parts of farm machinerv. Allen called his invention the Flexible Flyer.

> By the turn of the century, the demand for sleds, fueled partly by the popularity of the steering mechanism, was so high that labor-intensive detail such as hand-painted decorations, had to be changed to mass produced stenciling.
