Indications of the Lord's Return

At this present time, I have no idea how many times that I have used this topic in conversations and written articles. But first, let me say this, there is no man that can positively say just when our Lord will return. Jesus clearly states in **Matthew 24: 32-36**, saying in **verse 36**, concerning his coming, "But of that day and hour knoweth no man, no, not the angels of heaven, but my Father only." So, if anyone should claim to know for certain of that day, that person is making themselves equal unto God. But, he will come again as he has promised in **John 14:1-6**. Then, in **Revelations 14**, here is a future event in verse 7, a voice saying that the hour of his judgment is come! And in **verse 15**, the voice said, "... Thrust in thy sickle, and reap: for the time is come for thee to reap..." Only Almighty God can tell our Saviour just when that will be.

So, with all this being said, we ask how the Lord left us without any indications of world conditions that will be prevalent before he comes again? There were many given during the pre-flood years, and many were given during the destruction of Sodom and Gommorah. Also, our Lord gave many indications that pointed to the total destruction of Jerusalem. Nearly all of the chapter of Matthew 24 is given as an indication of the end of the Jewish Politico society. Still, they

do not all heed the warnings, but some did believe and fled the city to the city of Pella and did escape the annihilation of Jerusalem.

So, today, our Lord, through the prophetic mind of the Apostle Paul, gives us many indications of world events that are taking place at this very time. He says, "Know this also, that in the last days, perilous times shall come." Let me say this, if any of us of some age do not recognize that the world is teetering on the edge of great and terrible events, then we would have to have his head stuck in the sand somewhere. Also, in W. E. Vine's Concise Dictionary of the Bible words, he says that the term "last days" is used (**John 5:3**, **2 Peter 1:5**, **1 Peter 1:20** and **Acts 2:17**). But none of these are in reference to the term used in **2 Timothy 3:1**. The Greek term "Husteras" signifies, "now at last." (Page 34).

Now, in closing, if you will read **2 Timothy 3:1-5**, one can clearly see the conditions of the hearts of present day activities and know that this passage is given as a present-day indicator that the end is not far away. All of the things written have, or all now happening at the present time. I plead with you not to be as those Paul refers unto in **Chapter 4:3-4**. Many are rejecting the sound words that will save them, replacing them with philosophy and fables instead. But, if you choose to turn your ear from the truth, you can do so, and the Lord will not stop you. But, know this, you will be dooming your own souls in the process.

We are reminded throughout God's Word that He has given us the gift of choice and its consequences. Nowhere are we told that we cannot choose our destinies. But we are told that our choices determine our destinies. Even a casual reading of the New Testament tells us that there were those who followed Jesus because they wanted to get something from Him for selfish reasons. We read that when things looked horrible at His trial those who had been with Him for years fled for their lives. In His days of glamour and glory they were close by His side. There were others who wanted to be with Him but they refused to make any sacrifices and went their own way. A graduate of a Mid-

western university was just an average student. He played sports but never made any of the varsity teams. He was never elected to any office and did not make it far up the corporate ladder. When war broke out he was among the first to volunteer. After completing basic training he was sent to a war zone in France. One day in combat he was serving alongside a soldier in the French army. His comrade was severely wounded and with no thought of himself, he made a decision to get him help. Unfortunately, he did not succeed and was killed on his way to find a medic. The French Government learned of his act of bravery and awarded him The Croix de Guerre - Cross of War. And his alma mater posted a plaque in his honor that read, "He played with the scrubs for four years - but never quit." The psalmist said, "We will not turn away from You."
