

# Estill Lady Engineers Earning "Academic All-State" Totals 96

Ninety-six! That's the number of players from Estill County High School's fastpitch softball teams that has been named "Academic All-State" during the past 13 years.

Each year, starting with 2003, nearly every junior and senior from Estill's squad has been named 1st or 2nd team or "honorable mention" Academic All-State.

This year is no different except that the 2017 squad has every junior and every senior named "1st Team Academic All State."

Despite sacrificing long hours at practice and travel to games, the Lady Engineers' four juniors and three

seniors have each been able to compile a 3.75 or above grade point average.

Named "1st team" academic all-state for 2017 are seniors McKinley Meek, Abby Winkle and Taylor Wiseman, along with juniors Kaylee Covey, Lindsey Isfort, Sarah Wiseman, and Lindsey Wood.

Meek, Winkle and Wiseman, all made "1st team" in 2016 as well as juniors.

Only juniors and seniors are eligible and must have played in 50% of the varsity games. First team requires a gpa of 3.75 or better, while second team players must have a 3.5 to 3.74 gpa. Players with a 3.25 to 3.49 are named "honorable mention."

Eight players were named in each of four of those years and a total of ten received the honor in 2009. Seven were named in 2011, 2013 and now in 2017.

Although the regular "All State" and East-West players have not been named for 2017, two Estill players were named 2nd team All-State in 2016, Zoe Deaton and McKeely Muncie.

Twenty Lady Engineers have been named Athletics All-State since 2003, with seven Honorable Mention, nine "2nd Team" and four "1st team," (Amanda Hymmer in 2006, Brittany Thomas in 2007, Amanda Edwards in 2008 and Lyda Arvin in 2010).
