



It is easy to grow **coreopsis**, also known as tickseed or pot of gold. Sprinkle seeds over a prepared area of un-amended soil in spring in a full-sun location. Seeds of coreopsis plants need light to germinate, so cover lightly with soil, or simply press seeds into moist soil. Keep the seeds of coreopsis plants watered until germination, usually within 21 days. Once flowers are established, cut off spent blooms so the plant produces new flowers. - Brenda Weaver
