Luke 13:34, "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, which killest the prophets, and stonest them that are sent unto thee; how often would I have gathered thy children together, as a hen doth gather her brood under her wings, and ye would not!"

As I consider this verse I think of how that God sent Jesus to teach the people of Israel. He preached the word of God to them, as well as performing miracles.
