A black cannon safe, which contained money, was reportedly found in the garage.

IPD makes arrests

A bench warrant was served on Zachary Schooler, 24, of Phyllis Ann Court Irvine on July 29 by Irvine Officer Jason Conrad.

The bench warrant was signed by Estill District Judge William Leach saying Schooler failed to comply with conditions. School had been fourth guilty of fourth degree assault (domestic violence) on May 3, 2016. No bail was set.

Gary Rogers, 50, of Plum Street, Irvine faces new charges after a Madison County bench warrant was served on him on July 28 by Officer Conrad.

District Judge Earl Ray Neal signed the bench warrant because of FTV. Rogers had three contempt of court charges on July 26.

Judge Neal set Rogers' bail at \$250.00 cash.

During a search after the arrest, Officer Conrad said he located an empty syringe in Rogers' pocket. He then charged Rogers with drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

Charles Terry Maness, 38, of Autumn Court, Irvine was arrested July 27 for alcohol intoxication in a public place and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess by Officer Conrad.

The officer said he was dispatched to 312 Turner Avenue around 10:07 p.m. because two males were in a dispute.

He stated that Maness stated he had consumed alcohol a few hours prior, and an empty syringe was found in Maness' pocket during the search.

Police Chief Brad Smith arrested Frank Helton, 31, of Hood Avenue on July 28 during a traffic stop on Main Street.

Smith said he observed Helton's vehicle attempt to pass another vehicle while at a red light. He added the vehicle then turned left crossing the opposing lane of traffic to access a parking space on Main Street.

The citation states that Helton failed field sobriety tests. A small baggie was found during a search.

Helton was charged with

operating a vehicle under the influence, failure of owner to maintain required insurance, careless operation/driving, and drug paraphernalia buy/possess.

Tim Sizemore, 21, of Witt Ridge Road, Irvine was arrested July 26 by Sgt. John Sturniolo at Wallace Circle in Irvine on charges of domestic violence, alcohol intoxication, and criminal mischief second degree.

The citation states that Sizemore broke a storm window and kicked in a steel door causing severe damage to the door and deadbolt.

He allegedly assaulted his girlfriend by punching her on the left ear and slapping her left check.

The officer says that Sizemore assaulted the girlfriend in front of her three year old child as they were fighting on the kitchen floor.

A homeless man was arrested July 24 by Chief Smith for shoplifting and a bench warrant.

Smith said dispatch received a call about a shoplifter at Family Dollar on Winchester Road. The store manager told Smith she caught a man stealing \$10.87 worth of merchandise. The male refused to stop and fled the scene.

Smith said he located James Neal, 30, on Laurel Street, who was identified by Family Dollar employees.

Neal was charged with theft by unlawful taking or disposition/shoplifting.

Two bench warrants from Estill District Court was served on Neal for failure to pay.

He was found guilty of fourth degree assault on Dec. 14, 2016. A charge of alcohol intoxication was merged.

Judge Leach set Neal's bail at \$163.00 cash on this charge.

Neal was also found guilty of alcohol intoxication on Dec. 14, 2016 in another case. A warrant was issued on this case also for failure to pay.

Judge Leach set the bail at \$248.00 cash on this charge.
