Councilman William Van-Cleve questioned why the insurance had gone up significantly from the last time it was paid.

Mayor Estine Tipton replied that she had no idea but she and the new clerk were reviewing documents and would try to find documentation in regards to the insurance.

Councilwoman Snowden stated that she didn't feel like the council could approve the financial report with it in the shape it was in. She said she felt like they should table it until next month and

see if some of the numbers matched up at that time.

The tax rate was approved raised during the Ravenna by the council with a unanimous vote to keep it at the current rate. Mayor Tipton said that the insurance rate had been the same for several years.

Councilwoman Crowe asked if anything else would be done in regards to the findings of the attorney general that was released a couple of weeks ago about the violation of the opening meet-

Mayor Tipton said no that as far as she knew that everything had been taken care of and that from now on she would mail letters to the council instead of making phone calls when a special meeting Sharon would occur.
