Three House Fires, Three Days



Estill County Fire Chief Derrick Muncie called a mobile home fire on Leighton Road on Monday night suspicious. The homeowner, Russell Smith, recently passed away, and the mobile home did not have utilities connected. Anyone with information on the fire may contact Chief Muncie at 723-2661.

School board approves policy for medical director

A special meeting of the Estill County school board was called on August 3rd to discuss topics that needed immediate atten-

During the last board meeting Dr. Vivian Ong was appointed as medical director of the district while still utilizing the school nurses who are currently employed. The current policy had to be amended to reflect that change and to also allow nurses to supply basic treatment and over the counter medications to students when there is a

need for it.

Superintendent Jeff Saylor said Dr. Ong may also set up a telemedicine at one of the schools as well, but for now with the uncertainty of healthcare that will be something that they look at in the future. The second reading of the policy revision will be read on August 17th.

An emergency certification was granted by the board to fill a vacancy within the district. Mr. Saylor said that at this point they really have no other option because the vacancy must be filled.

A second collision involving a motorcycle and a truck occurred nearby on KY 52 around 12:40

The motorcycle operator was taken to the hospital where he was pronounced dead from his injuries.

The deceased man was identified as 61 year old Michael Riddell of Irvine. He was the first traffic fatality in Estill County for 2017.

The name of the driver of the vehicle involved in the collision with the motorcycle has also not

Both wrecks remain under investigation by Kentucky State Police.
