Irvine man charged with trafficking in methamphetamine

An Irvine man faces felwas reported stolen on September 8.

The sergeant arrested Jes-Sgt. John Sturniolo said se Ray Stone, 36, of Church Street, Irvine. Stone was charged with unauthorized use of motor vehicle, operating on a suspended license, trafficking in a controlled substance, and leaving the scene of an accident.

The citation states that vehicle on the front driver's substance field tested positive for methamphetamine and weighed 2.6 grams.

Irvine Police also report the reportedly stolen vehicle they recovered \$150.00 in cash.
