## Irvine man charged with trafficking in methamphetamine

An Irvine man faces felony charges after a vehicle was reported stolen on September 8.

Sgt. John Stumiolo said an Attempt to Locate was issued for a 2007 Chevy.

The owner's daughter attempted to stop this vehicle as it was leaving a residence after an Irvine man was allegedly buying meth.

She said that man hit her vehicle on the front driver's bumper which caused very minor damage.

Sgt. Stumiolo stopped the reportedly stolen vehicle within city limits.

He said the driver had two packages of methamphetamine in his right front jeans pocket.

The citation states the man would not tell whom he bought the meth from.

The sergeant arrested Jesse Ray Stone, 36, of Church Street, Irvine. Stone was charged with unauthorized use of motor vehicle, operating on a suspended license, trafficking in a controlled substance, and leaving the scene of an accident.

The citation states that substance field tested positive for methamphetamine and weighed 2.6 grams.

Irvine Police also report they recovered \$150.00 in cash.

Stone was lodged in the Three Forks Detention Center in Beattyville.

## Ravenna mayor breaks tie vote

Discord continued at Monday's meeting of the Ravenna City Council with the minutes of the last meeting not being approved.

The city's financial report was not approved last month, and a revised one was furnished Monday. However, three members voted against accepting the revised report.

Mayor Estine Tipton cast the deciding vote since the vote was tied at three and three. The financial report

passed.

Before the council voted, Mayor Tipton stated the new clerk Ashley Moore had straightened up the financial report.

Moore told the council that she had gone back to last October to get Quick Books straightened out.

"Maybe you ought to have an audit," Sharon Snowden told Mayor Estine Tipton.

The mayor said the auditors are getting ready to start on the fiscal year audit which ended June 30. An audit is

conducted annually.

A former councilman, Louis Officer, asked if the city receives a bank statement each month.

Councilman William VanCleve read Officer a statement saying that he could attend council meetings but could not speak.

VanCleve's statement was clarified by the city's attorney, Brooks Stumbo. The council must pass legislation if they do not want visitors to speak at meetings.

Mayor Estine Tipton read

the council a statement at the beginning of the meeting about how they were to conduct discussions of employees at meetings.

If a councilman wants to discuss an employee during a closed session, they must contact the mayor to request a closed session. If she decides on a need for it, a closed session will be held.

This was prompted by last month's meetings, at which comments were made openly about a city employee.
