A citation states that he became aggressive toward officers.

He was placed under arrest which he allegedly resisted.

The citation states he began to yell profanities in the jail parking lot, causing a public disturbance.

Chief Smith charged Mays with disregarding a traffic control device, speeding 26 mph or greater (work zone), fleeing or evading police, first degree (motor vehicle), wanton endangerment, first de-

gree, and reckless driving. Officer Cloyd cited Mays for assault third degree of a police officer, resisting arrest, and disorderly conduct.

An outstanding warrant for failing to pay a fine was also served on Mays.

He was found guilty in January of operating a motor vehicle under the influence, failure of owner to maintain required insurance, and terroristic threatening, third degree. Charges of disorderly conduct, failure to register transfer of vehicle, reckless driving, menacing, and four counts of wanton endangerment were merged.

Mays was lodged in Three Forks Regional Jail in Beattyville.
