Woman was arrested at hospital for stealing syringes, intoxication

A woman was arrested on felony charges June 29 at Marcum & Wallace Hospital after requesting to speak to an officer.

Deputy Daniel Smith answered the call to go to the hospital at 11 p.m. to talk with Chelsie Elizabeth McMillan, 26, who gave a Winchester address.

The citation states that McMillan had slurred speech and was confused and fidgety.

Smith said he saw McMillan take syringes from a hospital drawer.

He stated he asked McMillan three times if she

had anything in her possession, and she replied no. He charged her with public intoxication and theft by unlawful taking and took her to the Estill County Detention Center.

During a search at the jail, the citation states that seven syringes were found on McMillan. Two of them were loaded with an unknown substance.

The citation also says that she had an empty suboxone package, two claratin pills, a butane lighter, a pocket knife, and a cigarette were located in her possession.

After the jail search, Mc-

Millan was charged with promoting contraband first degree and possession of drug paraphernalia. All of the charges are misdemeanors except for promoting contraband.

McMillan appeared in Estill District Court on July 1. She pleaded not-guilty to all four charges. A preliminary hearing is set for July 8.

Bond for McMillan has been set at \$1,000 cash. Court records say that McMillan was arrested on new charges while a case was pending.

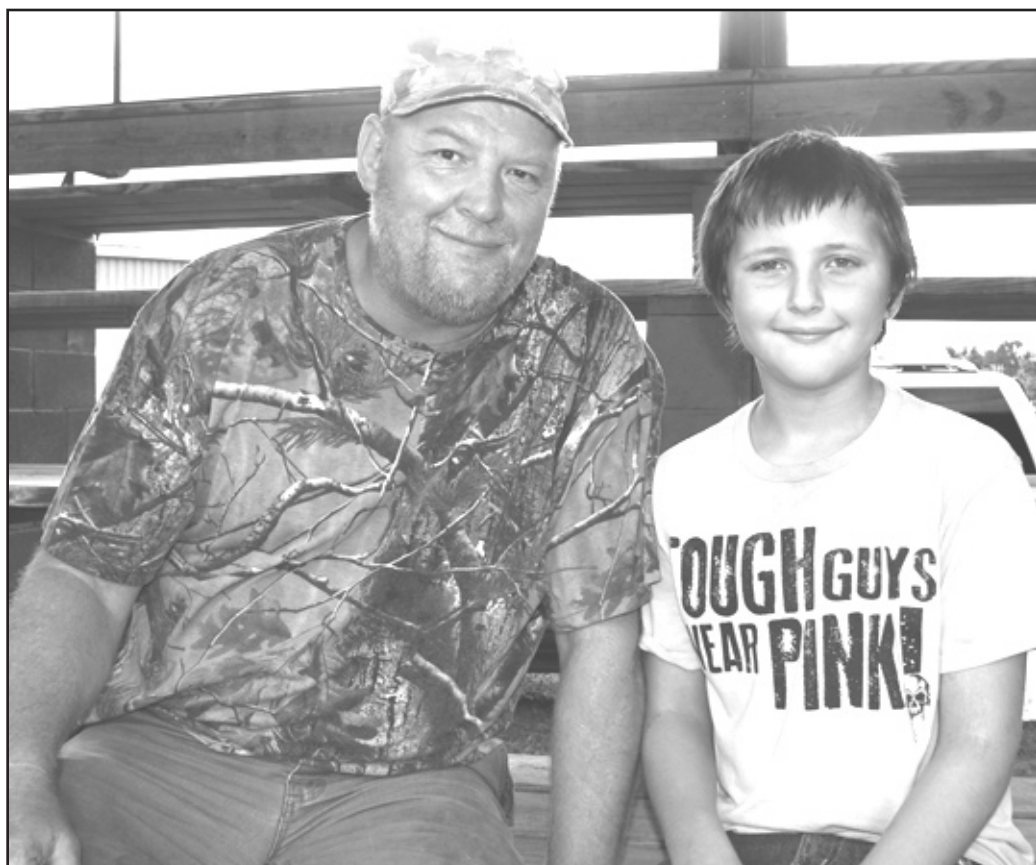
Riddell is new EMA Director

"Planning is a big part of what works," Riddell said.

EMA coordinates all agencies to make sure first responders have what they need during a disaster. This includes equipment and personnel. The emergency responders receive train-

ing throughout the year to prepare them for an actual event.

Besides natural disasters, such as record snowfall and flooding, Riddell recalls a train derailment, a pipeline explosion and an ice storm in 2009.
