

# A Sense of Urgency by BOB CASEY, preacher

### **Cornerstone Church of Christ Bond Street at Camp Avenue in West Irvine**

In <u>Luke 14:15-24</u>, here is the story told by Jesus concerning the coming great supper of the Lord. Today I want to use one statement that should be a constant plea of every Bible reader, every preacher for sure, and this is found in verse 23 of one text, where it was said by our Lord to His servants: "Go out unto the highways, and hedges, and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled." The word compel is rendered from the word urgency, also to necessitate, and constrain. If there was ever a time to preach these things, surely all can see it is needed more than ever today. How sad it is to see the majority of people pay little or no respect for our Lord and His people. Again, I repeat this warning to all of us, using Matthew 7:13-14, "Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat, because strait is the gate and narrow is the way, which *leadeth unto life, and <u>few there be that find it</u>.*" Here is an alarming and also a sad warning.

Because it tells us this, for the rest of our lives most of the people you will meet will die having never obeyed the Lord's will, and will be cast into the lake of fire for all eternity. So then, is it possible to meet, teach, or preach without a strong sense of urgency? We need to show a greater attitude toward the unrepented sinner, and also to the brethren whom have been complacent and relaxed in their faith. People are dying every day, young and elderly, so we need to show a greater sense of dedication to the call of our Lord. Where He says: "to come unto me." We need to urge everyone we meet to prepare to meet Jesus in judgment, and to meet Him as a saved person. How sad the words forecasted by our Lord in Matthew 7:23, "I never knew you, depart from me, *ye that work iniquity.*" For the unsaved, these will be the last words you will ever hear, but they do not have to be. You have the power to make a change, by hearing, believing, repenting, confessing your sins, and to solidify your conversion, by being baptized for the remission of your sins. This is the word of God unto you today: obey them before it is too late. Jesus is coming again!
