Are you a person that is concerned?

One cannot deny that we are living presently within a troublesome time with all the rhetoric that is being tossed around day by day, creating civil and political unrest in America. Yes, people are concerned when we have seen the arrest of one who has been accused of manufacturing devices that were designed to cause harm to others. This is civil concern. But we must remember that we have been forewarned of these times in 2 Timothy 3:1 when Paul called these times, perilous times or troubling times.

By the way, the word 'concerned' is defined this way, 'to make anxious or troubled, worried and interested.'

In **Luke 10:38-42**, Jesus was invited to the house of Mary, Martha and Lazarus to share in a common meal. So desiring to treat the Master to the best she had, Martha was scurrying about, being anxious for everything to be perfect. But Mary was more anxious to hear the words of Jesus more than a concern for what food was to be served. Martha, saying unto Jesus, "Lord, dost thou not care that my sister hath left me to serve alone? bid her therefore that she help me." This caused Jesus to remark, "But one thing is needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her." So, there should be no doubt in our mind concerning this teaching. Food, clothing and shelter are the necessary components that sustain and make this life more enjoyable, but in Matthew 6:25-34, our Lord tells us that our concern should not be on the physical things but first upon the things that are related to our righteousness with God. And he promises that if we will first be more concerned with our spiritual devotion, he will help us achieve the others.

But, then again, I can see in this world that a

great many are more concerned about things coming on the earth and are not seemingly troubled about the more-needful things like preparation for death and the Judgment before Jesus Christ in which we will all certainly have our part in. 2 Corinthians 5:10 declares it.

Another one of the saddest things of all in my mind is that parents are more anxious concerning the education and worldly achievements of their offspring, but they for the most part are leaving out the spiritual education that is most needed, for it will exist long after the diplomas of secular education are yellowed with age. Abraham Lincoln said "though a man may have all the educational advantage, and not be educated in the Bible, he is not totally educated." **Philippians 4:6** tells us how to deal with the matters of great concern, "Be careful (full of anxiety) for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God."

Another point at this time, in **2 Corinthians 11:28**, here in this chapter Paul was telling of all the anxious moments he had encountered serving the Lord, but when he concluded he said, "Beside those things that are without, that which cometh upon me daily, the care of all the churches." Yes, Paul loved the churches which he had a hand in their beginning. Yes, Paul was worried and concerned about them on a daily basis.

So, today, what message is there in this to all professing to be Christians? How much concern do you have for the church? Were you there last week? Do you help undergird its work with your totally due contributions, or do you give the Lord what is justly his? Malachi asked, 'Will a man rob God?' My vast experiences say, 'Yes, they are.' And many will continue to do so, thereby showing little concern for themselves and the church as well!

Hard sayings? You bet! But we need to be concerned enough in our preaching to tell the people the truth. The Lord is coming!

It's not unusual to hear someone say, "But I don't want to be a role model." But that's not the way it is. All of us are, at one time or another, a model who someone will try to imitate for one reason or another. David made this observation a long time ago. "My eyes will be on the faithful in the land," he said. When David looked for a role model he did not look for one who was famous or powerful, one who had wealth or riches, he looked for one who was "faithful to the Lord." He was committed to build his life on God's principles - principles that were eternal and everlasting. So, he searched for those who had God's purposes and plans in their minds and hearts, those were obedient to God. And when he found them he surrounded himself with them and even invited them to "dwell" with him. Someone once asked John Rockefeller, "How did you become so successful?" He looked at him sternly and said, "Because I surround myself with successful people!" Here we find a great lesson for life: If we want to achieve great things for God, we must surround ourselves with people who have done or are doing great things for God. We cannot become more than we are for God if we associate with and follow the examples of those who do not care much for God or do not have loving and serving God at the very center of their lives. David expressed his need for being surrounded by the "faithful." He knew that "He whose walk is blameless will minister to me."


