

Leslie Cornett is Inducted Into Estill Hall of Fame

Leslie Cornett was recognized by members of the school board for her achievement of being inducted into the Hall of Fame. Cornett began her teaching career in 1989 in the Perry County school district where she taught music. At that time there was only a high school academic team and Cornett wanted her children to participate in academics at an earlier age and so she organized an academic team for elementary and middle school students.

It wasn't until 1999 that Cornett began her teaching career at the Estill County Middle School. She taught language arts and coached the Future Problem Solving Team at the high school until 2001 when she took over the academic team at the middle school. Cornett's achievements include leading the FPS team at the high school to be district champs for 14 consecutive years, number one in the region for 11 of those years, and they qualified for state competition for 13 times. The middle school FPS team as well as the high school FPS team qualified for the international competition.

Cornett said that she sees her greatest achievement in the self-confidence displayed among team members and is most proud of seeing those students now as successful adults. Although Cornett retired in 2014 she is still active in the Estill County school system and continues to coach the high school FPS team and officiates league and Governor's Cup competitions.
