Ten Reasons, And More, That Will Prevent Men From Going to Heaven

In nearly 50 years of attempted preaching, there are not too many things left that I have not heard or had to deal with in my teachings required by the Lord to enter into His Heaven one day.

So today, I will mention some of the things I have heard in my time. Some have said, 'I don't want anyone to tell me what to do!' Now, I agree that all may have a sense of pride in self accomplishments in working in an attempt to implement their own ideas. There is nothing wrong with that! But to live as there was no God who has ordered this universe into existence is a bad idea. **Psalm 100:3** says, "Know ye that the LORD he is God: it is he that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are his people . . ." Then in **Romans 14:8**, "For whether we live, we live unto the Lord; and whether we die, we die unto the Lord: whether we live therefore, or die, we are the Lord's." So, he goes on to say that, "every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall confess to God. So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God." **(11-12)** So, then, our God does have the right to govern us.

Some say, 'I don't want to change my present lifestyle, even though it leaves out the acknowledgement of God and our Saviour Jesus Christ.' In **Luke 9:24**, "For whosoever will save his life shall lose it: but whosoever will lose his life for my sake, the same shall save it."

Many have said, 'I don't want to give up my present friends.' I add, if your friends are unconfessed sinners, you are in serious, grave danger as well as they. Notice **James 4:4**, "... know ye not that the friendship of the world is enmity with God? who-

soever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God."

Then, others have said, 'I don't want to oppose the religion of my mother or father.' Sadly, many will cling to their 'old time religion' even though it has never agreed with the Bible, and they know it.

'What will my friends say, I don't want to be called a Goody Two-Shoes!' **1 Peter 4:16**, "Yet if any man suffer as a Christian, let him not be ashamed; but let him glorify God on this behalf."

Some say, 'I love my present manner of life too much to rearrange it to follow the precepts of the Bible. I will have to give up too much, or it will ruin most of my weekends, etc.'

Others have said, 'I am a good man in my present state or condition, even though I do not attend any church anywhere. I don't believe if there is a God, he will punish me because I am not a bad person' And so, the list goes on and on . . .

In my experiences, this last person is the hardest person to convert to Jesus. How can one be saved unless they first recognize themselves to be unsaved, unprepared, not suitable to live in Heaven after the Judgment.

Here in **Revelations 21:5**, "But the fearful, and unbelieving, and the abominable, and murderers, and whoremongers, and sorcerers, and idolaters, and all liars, shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone . . ." He adds in **22:14**, "Blessed are they that do his commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city."



"What the eyes cannot see," says an old Dutch proverb, "the heart cannot crave." And the Italians seem to agree with one of their own: "If the eyes do not admire, the heart will not desire."

But long before them David had his own proverb that addressed the same issue: "I will set before my eyes no vile thing."

Our eyes are the gateway to our hearts, souls and minds. It is what we see, day after day, that shapes our thoughts and values and - ultimately our behavior. And that's the path to sin: First we look. Then we desire. Then we decide. Then we sin. Then we try to find an excuse. Then we lie. Then we try to hide our wrongdoing. But it's too late. The consequences will come.
