## My 90th Mission

Imagine teaching the principles of our Constitution and the US government to young Americans who you know will be the future leaders of our country. How do you even begin to explain what has happened to our nation over the past couple of years? The fake news, the personal attacks, the lack of truth and decency, the influence of foreign powers on our democracy, the divisiveness, and the labeling of "fascist" or "liberal" to anyone who doesn't think the same as them

As a 20-year combat Marine, my final assignment was to teach government at the US Naval Academy to young midshipmen who dedicate themselves to values like honor, courage, and commitment, and who volunteer to serve on the front lines of our nation's wars, risking their lives in defense of our country. We assume that our elected leaders are out for themselves, or for their party, unless they prove otherwise. Personal honor appears to no longer mean much in political discourse. Politicians have lost their courage to better the institutions that govern us because it's easier, politically, to demonize the concept of government itself.

Right now, we may have an entire generation that has no memory of a functioning American government that can work for the common good. I worry that our kids will never know that public service is a noble cause, and one worthy of patriotic Americans from all walks of life stepping into the political arena.

It's time for a new generation to stand up and answer the call to lead. This isn't just about one election or a set of issues or headlines. It's about the very soul of our democracy.

We need leaders who are powered by an army of small donors, not the wealthy special interest groups, or with their own checkbook. We need a generation that is ignited by the support of the people they pledge to represent. We need new leaders who will do the right thing by the people
