Saylor informed board members that he felt like the bus fleet was in pretty good shape at this time. He said they have purchased 13 new buses in the past four years and plan to purchase a couple more in the near future. He said that the district runs 27 regular routes each day and 3 handicapped routes.

BB&T had reached out to the school system about grants that they have available. Mr. Saylor said that they were not aware of those grants, they would be very useful to use for property surveys and other items, and that those grants would free up money that could be used in other areas.

The phone systems throughout the school district have recently been updated. Saylor said that it was a big cost to the district but is definitely worth the cost. He added that 12-14 new cameras are being installed at the high school to enhance security there.
