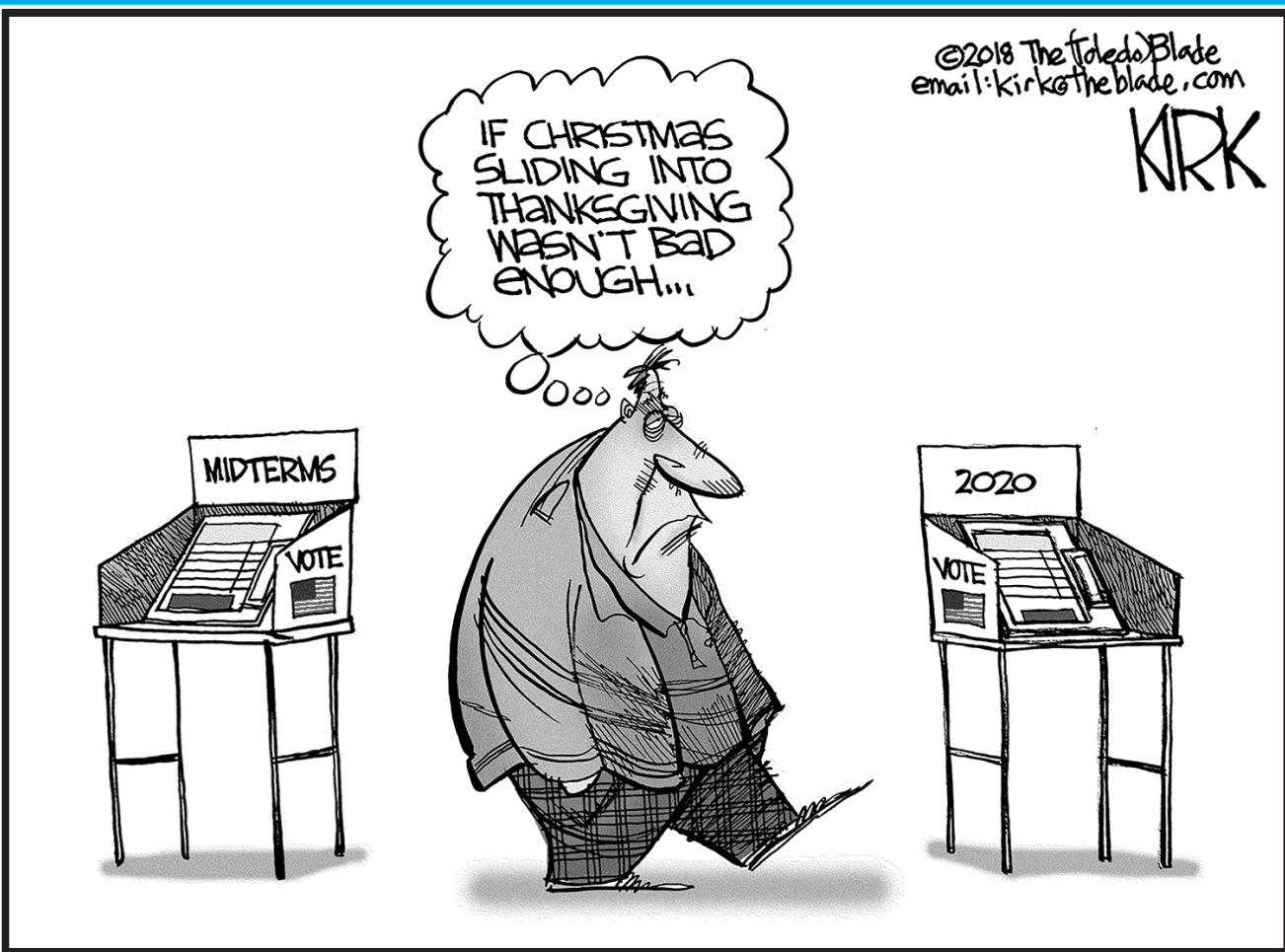

She said the man always complains about her dogs which she keeps in a fenced in yard.

"It's not just me he's a pain in the butt to. It's a lot of the neighbors," Carpenter added.

The man allegedly had trapped one of the neighbors cats in a cage and when the neighbor asked for it to be set free, he took it to the pound.

The lady was in attendance and said that she's afraid that the man is a little too 'trigger happy,' and that

it's not uncommon to hear gunshots at all hours of the day and night. They know it's him that is doing the shooting. Chief White said that there is an ordinance that there is to be no shooting firearms within city limits.

The council agreed to re-

schedule the official meeting for the month of November to Wednesday at 12:15. At that time the council will take care of the items that were on the agenda that they were unable to vote on during Monday night's meeting.

## Police Activity Report

• **Douglas Wayne Newman**, 31, of Moore Cemetery Road, Irvine was charged November 3 with possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (methamphetamine).

The citation states that KSP Trooper Carl Roark conducted a knock and talk at a shed on N. Minor Lane. He had been given permission by the owner to request anyone loitering on the property to leave.

It adds that Newman was found in the back shed but does not live on the property.

The trooper stated that Newman had a cigarette package with a \$10 bill folded to contain a crystal like substance. The substance was suspected meth.

He was lodged in Three Forks Regional Jail. Bail for Newman was set at \$5,000 cash.

• On November 5, **Brenda Ann Tipton**, 49, of Waco was arrested during a traffic stop at the intersection of Park Ave. and Orchard St. in Irvine.

Officer Colton Lewis wrote in the citation that Tipton's vehicle was seen leaving Shell Mart, and it failed to stop for a red light. The car had one working headlight.

The citation adds that Tipton's insurance on the car had expired a day earlier.

Inside her purse, the officer stated he found six individual bags of a crystal like substance (suspected methamphetamine) weighing over 8 grams.

He also reported finding a small pistol, but Tipton had been convicted of a felony in 1995.

The citation also states that a needle, multiple empty

baggies, and a clonazepam pill were found inside the purse.

Tipton was charged with disregarding a traffic control device, one headlight, failure of non-owner operator to maintain required insurance, trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense (over 2 grams methamphetamine), drug paraphernalia - buy/possess, possession of a controlled substance, third degree, and possession of a handgun by convicted felon.

Tipton's bail was set at \$10,000 cash.

• Two Estill District Court bench warrants were served on **Charles T. Maness**, 39, of Autumn Court, Irvine on Nov. 4 by Officer Jason Conrad.

One warrant states that Maness failed to appear on a charge of non-support. No bail was set.

The second warrant for KDP says Maness was found guilty in 2014 of operating on suspended or revoked operator license and no registration receipt.

Judge Leach set his bond at \$500 cash.

• **Jennifer Sparks**, 29, of Third Street, Ravenna was arrested Nov. 3 by Sgt. John Sturniolo of the Irvine Police Dept.

She was charged with trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

Her citation states that she agreed to sell methamphetamine to a confidential informant working for IPD. It adds that she picked up the informant and drove to a location and purchased methamphetamine for cash.
