7 Plea Guilty on the Rocket Docket

Seven individuals pled guilty to felony charges by the Rocket Docket program and waived indictments to the Estill County Grand Jury.

Jason Jordan waived an indictment on charges of operating a motor vehicle under the influence, possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, and tampering with physical evidence.

The waiver states that on October 6, Jordan had methamphetamine in his possession and tried to conceal it.

Jordan pled guilty on Nov. 1 to the above three charges. A diversion order was entered.

Charges of instructional permit violation and failure of non-owner to maintain a required insurance were consolidated.

Matthew T. King, 33, of Webb Road, Irvine pled guilty to theft of identify of

another without consent.

The waiver said he gave the officer false information on Oct. 15, due to having a possible child support warrant.

King was sentenced by Judge Michael Dean, and a judgment was entered.

Christopher A. Thacker, 23, of North Plum Street, Irvine entered guilty pleas to resisting arrest, possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, and tampering with physical evidence.

The waiver states that Thacker possessed hydrocodone on Oct. 11 and tried to conceal it. A diversion order was entered for Thacker.

Kendra D. Ivey, 21, of Richmond Road, Irvine waived an indictment to a charge of theft of identity of another without consent.

The waiver states that she gave false information on Oct. 5 due to having a war-

Each candidate carried three of the six precincts.

Abney received 808 votes to Ballard's 802 votes.

There is no word yet if there will be a recount in this race.

James Goosey was the winner of Constable in District 1. He edged Constable Ricky Williams for the victory.

The winner of Magistrate in District 2 was Paul Tipton with 66 percent of the vote.

Gerry Flannery was elected as Constable in District 3 over Gary Robinson.

Flannery carried all four voting precincts in the district.

Flannery was elected four years ago as Magistrate of District 2 but had to resign when he moved out of the district.

Floyd Edmonson was re-elected as Constable in District 3 with 53 percent of the vote. His opponent, Ronnie Means, received 47 percent.

Andy Barr received 3,948 votes in Estill County to Amy McGrath's 1,471 for sixth district U.S. Congressman. Barr received 51 percent of the votes cast in the sixth district to be declared the winner, and McGrath had 48 percent.

Toby Herald carried Estill County with 61 percent of the votes for the 91st District State Representative. Cluster Howard received 39 percent.

Howard was declared the winner of the district, made up of Estill, Lee, Owsley, Breathitt and a precinct in Madison counties, with 7,385 votes. Herald received 7,378 votes, a difference of seven votes.

A recount of the votes in that race will be held this Thursday at 9 a.m.

Herald is currently serving as state representative. This is the third time the two men had faced each other, with Howard winning four years ago, then Herald two years ago.

The top six vote getters for the Irvine Council were Tim Burkhart, Les Withers, Billy Dean Arthur, Glenwood "Woody" Tipton, Ernest Lee Farmer, and Derrick L. Muncie.

Ravenna Mayor Estine Tipton was re-elected with 57 percent of the vote to Councilwoman Sharon

Snowden's 43 percent.

Elected to the Ravenna council were Valeri Henderson Flinchum, William C. Van Cleve, Brenda Abney, Amy Crowe, Beverly Thompson, and Tammy Smyth Howell.

Debra Hembree Lambert received 80 percent of Estill County's votes for Justice of the Supreme Court, third district. She was also the district-wide winner with 65 percent of the votes over Dan Ballou.

Several officials were unopposed, but their names also appeared on the ballot. They were Heather Buntin Combs, Commonwealth Attorney; Stephanie L. Bringer, Estill Circuit Clerk; Jeff L. Hix, Property Valuation Administrator; Anthony "Tony" Murphy, Coroner; Justin M. Rogers, County Surveyor; Paul "J.P." Barnes, Constable District 2; James Edward Gross, Irvine Mayor; William "Bo" Leach, District Judge; Shiela B. Samples, Board of Education, district 3; and Bryan Covey, Board of Education, district 5.

Estill Countians narrowly voted in favor of a constitutional amendment, known as Marsy's Law, with 2,438 yes votes to 2,400 no votes. Sixty-three percent of the voters statewide voted in favor of Marsy's Law.

The wording that was on the ballot has been challenged through the legal system.

Sixty seven percent of the voters in the Cow Creek precinct voted in favor of selling alcoholic beverages at distilleries located in that precinct. Currently, a moonshine distillery is the only one located in the precinct.

In Madison County, Jennie Haymond was elected for her first term as County Attorney over Robert Jennings.

Haymond is a partner in the Davis Law Office and has served Rodney Davis as an assistant Estill County Attorney.

Vote counting was delayed until around 7:30 p.m. last Tuesday as there were still lines in at least three precincts at 6 p.m. Those precincts included Forks, Cedar Grove, and Drowning Creek. Anyone who is standing in line at 6 p.m. is allowed to vote.
