Jail escapee is back in custody

Casey Myers now faces new charges

from Estill County jail staff on October 10 is now back in jail at the Madison County Detention Center.

The Richmond Police Department was dispatched early Friday morning to Primrose Circle to investigate a suspicious person in the area.

When the officers arrived on the scene, they reported they saw Casey Allen Myers, 31, of Louisville walking toward Kerns Way.

Myers' citation states that he was dressed in camouflage and was carrying a black

It adds that Myers began to Kerns Way onto Primrose Circle and into a back yard of a residence, where he fell.

> The citation says that Myers also attempted to stand up after the officers placed him on the ground to handcuff

Myers reportedly told Richmond Police that he was wanted on an Estill County warrant for second degree es-

Richmond Police searched Myers and stated they found several tools used for burglary, including pliers, wire cutters, a knife and a camouflage ski mask.

The Richmond Police flee on foot. He ran left from charged Myers with second degree fleeing or evading police (on foot), resisting arrest, and possession of burglary tools.

Irvine Police arrests Cherry St. couple on drug charges and endangering child

Chief Brad Smith said the department went to 104 Cherry Street to pick up Ernest Lynn Jones, 36, on drug trafficking charges.

The police chief stated that a small child was visible through the front door. The child's mother, Kelsey Renee Bowman, 22, told the officers that Jones was not at home.
