The bench warrant had been issued on Nov. 28 by District Judge William "Bo" Leach because Bishop had failed to pay fines and/or court costs.

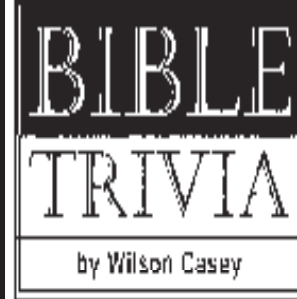
Bishop was found guilty in Estill District Court on May 18 of fleeing or evading police, second degree (motor vehicle). Indictment returned for drug trafficking

An Estill County man was indicted December 4 by the Grand Jury.

Donald Ray Hardy, 65, of W. Cedar Grove was indicted for two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and second offense, and being a second degree persistent felony offender.

The indictment states that on July 20, Hardy sold five hydrocodone pills to a cooperating witness for \$50.

It adds that on August 8, he sold four hydrocodone

pills to a cooperating witness for \$40.

According to the indictment, Hardy was previously convicted of a felony offense.

The investigation was conducted by Sgt. John Sturmiolo of the Irvine Police Department.

Information on other indictments returned by the grand jury was unavailable at press time.

An indicted person is presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

Deputy charges man with receiving stolen items

A Midway man was arrested Dec. 4 on an Estill County warrant charging him with receiving stolen property.

Deputy Sheriff Chris Coffey obtained the warrant on Zachary Lee Thomas, 23, in November.

The warrant states that from May 1 until October 26, that Thomas had in his possession a laptop, a tabled, Husqvarna model 51, drill set, kitchen knife set, cell phone, necklace, portable DVD player, and a small air

compressor. The items were reported stolen by Jamie Prather.

Deputy Coffey states that Thomas pawned the items at Cash Express and Estill Gun & Pawn. The items were valued at over \$500 but less than \$10,000.

Thomas' bail was set at \$2,500 cash.

He will be arraigned Wednesday in Estill District Court.

Thomas was incarcerated when he was served with the arrest warrant.

Police Activity Report

A Lee County indictment warrant was served on George T. Harrison on December 6 by Irvine Officer Colton Lewis.

The warrant was issued by Circuit Judge Michael Dean, over a year ago on November 24, 2017.

According to the warrant, Harrison was indicted in Lee County for receiving stolen property under \$10,000, possession of burglary tools, and failure of owner to maintain required insurance, first.

Alicia Strange, 27, of Cantrill Street, Irvine was arrested December 2 by Officer Jason Conrad.

Judge Dean signed the warrant on November 19. It says that Strange violated the conditions of her release by absconding probation. No bond was set.

On October 26 of this year, Strange was given a diverted sentence for receiving property under \$10,000.

An Estill County indictment warrant on ten charges was served December 9 by Officer Lewis on Charles W. Horn, 56, of Front Street in Irvine.

The warrant charges Horn with trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree and first offense; possession of a controlled substance, third degree; assault third degree of a police officer; two counts of wanton endangerment, second degree of a police officer; drug paraphernalia -buy/possess; failure to comply with bicycle safety regulations; fleeing or evading police, second degree (motor vehicle); resisting arrest; and persistent felony offender.
