Law officers shown appreciation by Irvine church and businesses

Estill County's law officers were honored Saturday with a meal and gifts during an Officer Appreciation event coordinated by the Body of Christ Ministries and its pastor, Bro. Bill Wesley.

This is the fourth year that Body of Christ and businesses have honored law enforcement, but this year's was the biggest.

Several notable speakers were present, including Jenell Brewer, the founder of SPARK ministries, who spoke on Casey's Law.

Brewer said when she needed help with family members, the people she talked to about Casey's Law didn't know what she was talking about.

Brewer said as of Saturday, her daughter has been clean for nine months now.

She added that SPARK Ministries doesn't just help the addicts, it also helps their families.

A SPARK office opened in Irvine in October. It is located upstairs at the Christian Worship Center on Broadway.

Since the office opened, Brewer said that 15 Casey's Law warrants have been served in Estill County. Only seven were served in the previous five years.

"If we can't get them served, we can't get them in a courtroom," she stated.

Then she asked what officer had been serving the Casey's Law warrants, and KSP Trooper Ty Robinson

raised his hand.

Anyone, with a close relative on drugs or alcohol who wants them to get help, can visit the SPARK office, and they will begin the process of Casey's Law on the individual, regardless of age. Misty Dehart, a former addict, is the advocate at the Irvine Spark office. Rick Prewitt is the director.

When the case gets into court, the judge then orders the addicts into rehabilitation. Circuit Judge Michael Dean and District Judge William Leach are both support-

ive of the program.

Kentucky Supreme Court Justice Elect Debra Hembree Lambert was present. Lambert, along with Judge Dean, is a big supporter of the Drug Court program. She was the guest speaker for a Drug Court graduation in the 23rd judicial district in the spring.

On Saturday, she presented a weapon to Ashley Flynn, wife of sheriff-elect Chris Flynn, who was attending sheriff's training and could not attend the event.

Irvine woman is arrested on drug-related charges

An Irvine woman was arrested by Irvine Police on Nov. 29 on drug related charges.

Lisa Boswell, 48, Winchester Road, Irvine was arrested IPD Chief Brad Smith.

The chief stated that he was responding with Probation and Parole to a residence on Winchester Road.

During a home visit, the parole officer had observed Boswell pushing items from a table into a trashcan, according to the citation.

Smith said the trash can had a small bag of suspected methamphetamine and several

meth pipes.

He added that Boswell seemed to be under the influence of methamphetamine.

The citation states that IPD also found two suboxone pills.

Boswell was charged with two counts of possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense, tampering with physical evidence, and drug paraphernalia - buy/possess.

The citation states that Boswell is also known Lisa Percell and Lisa Holt.
