

Local Police Activity Report

Joseph D. Harrison, 30, of Broadway, Irvine was arrested by Irvine Officer Brian Cloyd on March 18 on a bench warrant from Madison District Court.

The warrant states that Harrison failed to appear on theft and contempt of court charges.

•Twin brothers from Mount Sterling were arrested March 18 following a traffic stop by Officer Cloyd.

The vehicle driven by Taylor D. Crawford, 23, was traveling west on Rice Street at a high rate of speed, the citation states.

The car also had no tail lights and Cloyd said it turned right onto Main without signaling.

The officer charged Crawford with operating a motor vehicle under the influence, license to be in possession, second degree disorderly conduct, failure to improper signal, no brake lights, and failure to produce insurance card.

His brother, Tyler Crawford, was charged with alcohol intoxication in a public place and second degree disorderly conduct.

•Three arrest warrants were served March 17 by

Officer Cloyd on Brian Bowman, 27, of South Irvine Road.

All three warrants were from Estill District Court and Judge William Leach issued them because Bowman had allegedly failed to pay fines.

Bowman was found guilty August 15 of operating a motor vehicle under the influence. One headlight, failure to wear seat belts, and failure to produce insurance card. Bail in this case was set at \$588.00 in cash.

He was found guilty on August 9 of criminal mischief and disorderly conduct. This bail was set at \$438.00 in cash.

Bowman was also found guilty on August 9 of failure of owner to maintain required insurance. Charges of no registration plates, no registration receipt, obstructed vision, and failure to wear seat belts were merged.

The bail was set at \$110.00.

•Felisha Ann Lewis, age 27, of Crestview Court, Irvine was arrested for shoplifting March 16 by Officer Cloyd.

The citation says that an

ATL (Attempt to Locate) was issued for Lewis after she allegedly shoplifted several electronic key-chains at Shellmart.

The officer located Lewis driving on Kirkland Ave. He said he recovered 14 electronic key chains valued at \$7.99 each or a total of \$111.85. Recovered property was returned to its owner.

•Stacy Lewis was arrested on a Madison County Circuit Court bench warrant by Officer Cloyd on March 15.

The warrant was for contempt of child support order.

•Preston Hardy was arrested by Chief Brad Smith on March 15 on a parole violation warrant from the Kentucky Parole Board.

Hardy had been convicted on two charges of possession of a controlled substance, first degree (drug unspecified and methamphetamine) in Estill County. He was paroled on February 1, 2018.

The warrant said that Hardy has absconded parole supervision, failed to report change in home address to parole officer, and failed to report to parole officer as

directed.

•William B. Poynter, 56, of Broadway, Irvine was charged March 12 with operating a motor vehicle under the influence and disorderly conduct second degree by Officer Cloyd Lewis.

•Jessica Rose, 35, of Plum Street, Irvine was arrested March 18 by the Irvine Police Department on charges of criminal trespassing and resisting arrest.

The citation states that she climbed through a window at 294 Turner Avenue while the victim was not at home. Family members confronted her and asked her to leave.

•An arrest warrant was served March 15 by Officer Lewis on Rodney S. Hix, 41, of Hicks Lane, Irvine. The warrant was issued by Judge William Leach for Lee District Court because Hix failed to pay a fine.

Hix was found guilty on August 1 of careless driving, failure to wear seat belts, failure to produce insurance card, failure of owner to maintain required insurance, and driving on DUI suspended license.

Judge Leach set Hix's bail at \$340.00.

KSP investigation leads to arrest on March 17th

A Dry Branch man was arrested on a warrant March 17 by Deputy Russell Morris.

The warrant obtained by KSP Trooper Toney Allen charged Derrick Scott Moore, 32, with criminal mischief, first degree.

It states that on March 5, Moore damaged prop-

erty belonging to Victoria Caldwell.

It adds that he kicked the passenger side door of Caldwell's 2015 Chevrolet Malibu and jumped on its hood and windshield. Damages were estimated at \$4,700.00.

Moore's bond was set at \$2,500 cash.

The county road foreman is expected to retire at the end of this month, and the county treasurer on June 30.

Williams said the new employees will help with the transition.

He had gone to Jackson on Monday to the District Highway office. Estill County will be receiving approximately \$411,000 for road secondary funds. The judge said five roads have been recommended which will cost \$479,000, possibly meaning that some of the road projects will not be done as the estimates exceed the available funds.

Kim Dawes gave a solid waste report. This Friday and Saturday are Commonwealth Clean-up Days.

During the last month, the county has investigated five dump sites, which led to the discussion of cleaning up the county.

Dawes said Friday, April 20 in Earth Day. Courthouse employees will be picking up trash between 11 and 2.

Groups will begin picking up roadside trash in April and again in June.

"We're going to start mowing soon," Williams stated. "If (campaign signs) are on the right of way, they're going to get chopped up."

Williams discussed getting with businesses who are placing their signs in right of ways and on utility poles.

Dawes said this is Estill's year for a tire amnesty, but the county is not scheduled for it. She said the county will get a \$4,000 waste tire grant.

County attorney Rodney Davis said that a court hearing between the county and landfill is scheduled for 9 a.m. Thursday over the TENORM lawsuit.

He added there has been a lot of activity on Mt. Springs Road recently. At his request, the fiscal court went into closed session to discuss litigation.

IPD arrests local man on four warrants from Fayette for sex abuse

Irvine Officer Cloyd Lewis arrested an Estill County man on four Fayette County warrants for sex related offenses on March 15.

Each of the Fayette warrants is for one charge only. They were obtained by Tyler Smith of the Lexington Police Department and signed by District Court Judge J. Goodman.

The sex offenses allegedly occurred over a two year period between March 2008 and March 2010. The victim was approximately 13 or 14

years old at the time.

The warrants state that on Sept. 13, 2017, the victim contacted John Timmons Peel, 48, of Warner Lane, Irvine.

The warrants state that Peel previously pled guilty to sex abuse second degree for an incident involving a juvenile. Peel attended sex offender classes.

The four new warrants charge Peel with third degree sodomy, incest, and two charges of first degree sexual abuse.

KSP serves warrant: arrests man on new drug related charges

KSP Trooper T. Robinson arrested Christopher E. Tipton, 40, of Old Fox Road, Irvine, March 7 on new charges after serving a warrant on him.

Tipton was charged with possession of a controlled substance, first degree (methamphetamine) and drug paraphernalia buy/possess.

The trooper said while Tipton was being arrested,

KSP found two syringes and multiple pink baggies in his jeans. Three of the baggies allegedly contained a white powdery substance suspected to be methamphetamine.

Tipton was lodged in the Three Forks Regional Jail.

His bond was set at \$2,500. Court documents state that Tipton was arrested on a new charge while he had charges pending.

Woman arrested after squabble with brother where gun is fired

A woman living on Ida Grace Road was arrested March 11 by Trooper C. Caudill after a gun was fired at her residence.

The trooper said he was called to the residence to investigate a fight between a brother and a sister.

Alicia Abel, 31, said her brother got mad because he thought she had grabbed her child too roughly.


The siblings began to argue and Abel told the trooper that she punched her brother, Michael Grace, in the face. Then Michael

allegedly slapped her.

The citation states that Abel got a .22 long rifle from her parents' residence. Her father tried to take the gun from her and during the struggle, the gun discharged into the ground at her father's feet.

Abel was charged with fourth degree assault and wanton endangerment first degree.

Her bail was set at \$2,500 cash. Court records say she was arrested on a new charge while a case is pending.
