

Irvine officers keep busy on serving arrest warrants

Two new charges were made against an Irvine after Irvine Officer Brian Cloyd served two arrest warrants on her on Friday night.

Officer Cloyd said after he served the warrants, Patricia Meacake, 53, began screaming profanities while walking to his cruiser.

He added that she refused to get into the patrol car and would not comply with the officer's commands.

The two warrants against Meacake were issued because she allegedly failed to appear for arraignments in Estill District Court.

She was to have been arraigned on charges of theft by deception, including cold checks, and public intoxication.

District Judge William Leach did not set a bond on those two charges.

• An Estill County man faces numerous traffic charges following a high speed chase on Friday night.

Officer Brian Cloyd said he observed Michael Bishop, 22, of Rice Station Road, Irvine traveling east on Rice Street at a high rate of speed. The officer added that the driver disregarded a stop sign at the intersection of Rice and Laurel Streets.

The officer stated that when he activated his emergency lights and siren, the driver failed to stop.

He added that Bishop traveled about one mile before stopping on Sweet Lick Road.

The citation states the passengers in Bishop's vehicle had begged him to stop when they saw blue lights.

Bishop was charged with fleeing or evading police, second degree (motor vehicle), license to be in possession, driving too fast for traffic conditions, reckless driving, disregarding stop sign, failure to or improper signal, and failure to produce insurance card.

• Five bench warrants from Estill District Court were served on Timothy L. Sizemore, 21, of Witt Ridge, Irvine on March 10 by Officer Brian Cloyd.

Sizemore was found guilty of receiving stolen property on April 12, 2017.

Warrants were issued because Sizemore had failure to appear for motion hour and to appear for sentencing on that charge. No bail was set by Judge Leach.

Sizemore was found guilty in district court of assault fourth degree and criminal mischief second degree on August 9, 2017. A third charge, alcohol intoxication in a public place was merged.

Three warrants were issued because Sizemore re-

portedly failed to appear for motion hour, failed to pay fine, and failed to appear for sentencing on probation revocation.

Judge Leach set Sizemore's bail at \$1,757.38 because of his failure to pay a fine.

• Irvine Officer Colton Lewis served an arrest warrant on Sandra J. Eversole, 47. She reportedly failed to appear in Estill District Court on a pre-trial conference.

Eversole had been charged with second degree disorderly conduct, alcohol intoxication in a public place, and resisting arrest.

No bail was set by Judge Leach.

• Jonathon Duane Smith-Faucett, 28, of Pea Ridge Road, Irvine was arrested March 7 by Officer Colton Lewis.

The officer said he saw Smith-Faucett's vehicle traveling west on River Drive but it had no working brake lights.

The citation states the driver had one marijuana cigarette in his pocket.

The officer charged Smith-Faucett with operating on suspended or revoked operators license, possession of marijuana, and no tail lamps.

A district court arrest warrant was also served on Smith-Faucett.

He was found guilty on May 17, 2017 of following another vehicle too closely and possession of marijuana. A third charge, owner to notify clerk of residence or name change was merged.

Judge Leach issued the warrant because Smith-Faucett allegedly failed to pay

his fine. The judge did not set a bail.

• Daniel W. Denny, 25, of Dry Branch Road, Irvine was arrested March 6 on a bench warrant by Officer Colton Lewis.

Denny was found guilty in district court on July 13, 2017 of operating on a suspended or revoked license and failure of non-owner to maintain required insurance.

The warrant was issued because Denny reportedly failed to pay his fine.

• A bench warrant for failure to pay was served March 6 on Natasha A. Rogers, 30, of Sweet Lick Road, Irvine.

Rogers was found guilty of alcohol intoxication in a public place on July 20, 2017.

Judge Leach issued the warrant because she had failed to pay her fine.

The judge set Rogers' bail at \$248.00 cash.

• Officer Lewis served an arrest warrant on Monica Neal, 26, of Flinchum Ridge Road, Irvine on March 10.

The arrest warrant was issued by Judge Leach because Neal failed to appear for alcohol intoxication in a public place and resisting arrest.

The judge did not set bail for Neal.
