

Lindsey Wood is named 2018 Elisha Witt DAR 'Good Citizenship Winner'

Lindsey Claire Wood, daughter of Daniel and Margaret Wood, a senior at Estill County High School was presented the Good Citizenship Award at the March 17th meeting of the Elisha Witt Chapter DAR. This award is given each year by the Elisha Witt Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution. The contest is intended to encourage and reward the qualities of good citizenship. The student selected must have the qualities of dependability, service, leadership and patriotism. The contest consists of two parts. Part I: student describes how he/she has tried to manifest the qualities of a good citizen, an official grade transcript and two letters of recommendation. Part II: An essay is to be administered under the supervision of a faculty or DAR member and must be completed in one sitting within a two-hour time frame.

Lindsey is an Honors Student and Senior Class President. She has held office in the Junior Class, Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America and Student Council. She is a member of the Beta Club, Green Team, Newscast, Student Advisory Council, French Club, Softball team, Soccer Team, and a Cheerleader. Other activities include working for the Citizen Voice and Times News as a reporter, which is a paid position. She is a member of the Irvine First Christian Church, a volunteer for Salvation Army and Special Olympics. Her hobbies include; traveling, reading, hiking, running, painting, and listening to public radio.

Lindsey's essay addressed the focus question: "How has America advanced the cause of freedom in the rest

of the world?" Part of Lindsey's essay:

"I believe America's role in advancing freedom worldwide is epitomized in their part in World War II, which was very much a war of ideologies. Germany, Japan, and Italy represented totalitarian rule and oppression of free thought, but America and many of its Western European allies stood for democracy and freedom. Americans who lived through the war (who were later rightfully dubbed the "greatest generation") felt a rush of patriotism not because they were forced to, but because they felt actual admiration for their country and its cause: they understood that freedom was something worth fighting and possibly dying for. American soldiers liberated Jews from the concentration camps of Nazi Germany, fought bravely on the beaches of France, and remained firm in their beliefs as they battled the Japanese at Iwo Jima. Through their efforts, they helped to preserve and protect democracy worldwide. Imagining if Americans had watched passively as authoritarian rule swept Europe and Asia; the world would most certainly have been a less free place today."

Lindsey says: I plan to attend a four-year university and study English, Russian, or History. I would like to go on to graduate school and earn the highest degree in my field and eventually teach at a college or university. My aspiration in life is to lead a life of service; I hope that I can look back on my life and say I made a difference in other people's lives. I also hope to be a life-long learner, always humble and more apt to listen than to speak. Fur-

thermore, I would like to remain politically active my entire life because I think it is my duty as a member of a democracy to use my vote and my voice to the causes I care about (like gender and racial equality, environmentalism, freedom of the press, honesty and transparency in government, among other things).

After the presentation, refreshments were served by hostesses Janice and Ellen Bush to Lindsey, Danny and Margaret Wood, Susan Hawkins, Faye Reece, Bobby Carol Noland, Phyllis Dunaway, Sherry Butler and Myra Finney.
